The Nagy-Eged-hill is one of the most valuable and most unique wine-producing regions of Central Europe, which excelled the other terroirs and vineyards already in the 18th century. The Kékfrankos-vineyard of the Kovács Nimród Winery here is the highest altitude Kékfrankos-terroir of Central Europe.

The virgin harvest of the Kékfrankos, which was planted in 2004 is the 2008 vintage Grand Bleu. A unique style, unrepeatable wine was born; altogether 300 bottles, of which only 100 are left. 50 of these are available now for collectors and investors. Not long ago, Dr. Gabriella Mészáros international wine academic has tasted the wine. Based on her experience she said: "Nimród Kovács put on the right horse, when he mainly planted Kékfrankos on this magnificent area. The virgin

harvest, irrespective of wine region or variety has a special significance; it is unrepeatable, and it can only be born once; thus, its collector value is remarkable as well. Beyond that, however, the wine has astonished me in the best sense. It started with a cool and elegant appearance and fragrance, with an exuberance of mint, thyme and basil. But the true magic is the taste! The gulp is smooth and silky, with vivid acids and a fine, deliciously spicy fruitiness. It offers perfect harmony. This wine is perfection itself. I do not rule out the possibility that angels were involved in the making of this wine."
